INT. HANOVER HOUSE - DINNER TABLE - MOMENTS LATER

JOSH and MARCI finishing the last of their dinner. Soft MUSIC plays from the kitchen.

JOSH

(enthusiastic)

So, Marci, I want to show you something, well actually it's more of an idea I thought I would propose.

MARCI glances up at JOSH, mouth still full of food. JOSH Steps away from the table and walks out of the room.

MARCT

What did you buy this time?! I told you we don't need anymore-

JOSH walks into the room with a large glass jar.

MARCI (CONT'D)

(confused)

A jar? What are you planning on doing with that.

JOSH walks to the table setting down the jar.

JOSH

We're gonna put money in it!

MARCI

We?

JOSH

Yes we. Let me explain.

MARCI rolls her eyes, JOSH continues.

JOSH (CONT'D)

Can you remember the last time we did something nice? Like take a vacation?

MARCI

INT. HANOVER HOUSE - LIVING ROOM - AFTERNOON

MARCI
